These files would be delivered via a link to cloud storage (an electronic folder in OneDrive) that is maintained by the City of Boulder. To receive electronic files, you would need to provide a secure email address, and you would be responsible for downloading the files within one week of their placement in OneDrive. **No cost is associated with the transfer of electronic copies.**
