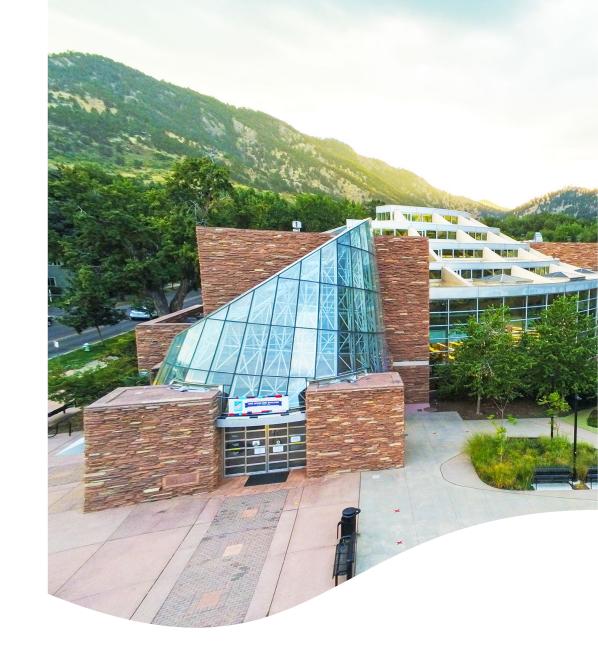


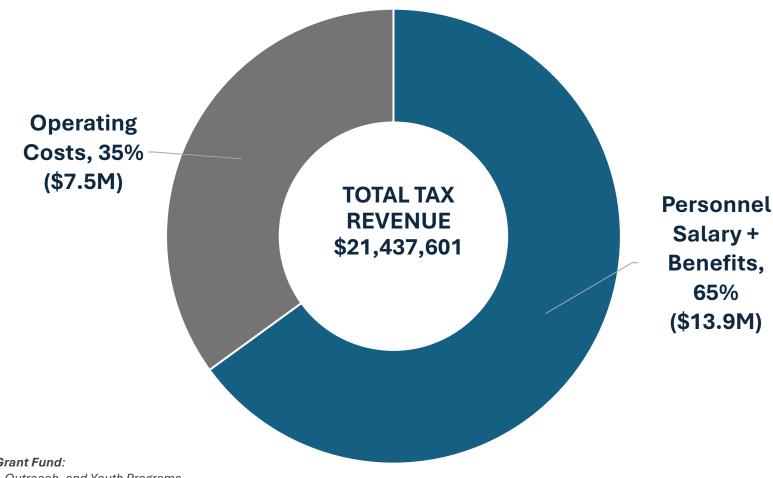


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2025 Property Tax Revenue Allocation

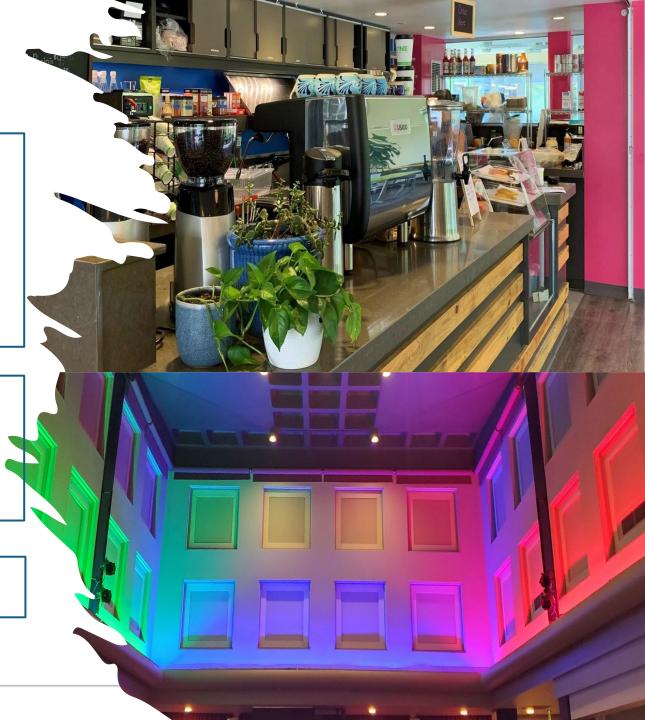
System Enhancements

- Point of Sale System for café and library service points
- Canyon and Arapahoe Meeting Room AV equipment
- Main Library Second Floor Modifications
- Main Library Canyon Theater sound system and projector replacement

Administration Services Support & Café Staff

- 1 FTE HR Coordinator
- 1 FTE HR Training and Learning Coordinator
- 1 FTE Accounting Specialist to support accounts payable processes and ensure compliance
- 1FTE Café Manager for more consistent coverage and operating hours





Compensation Study & Annual Increase

Compensation Philosophy (Draft in Progress):

- **Annual Increase:** Recommending a 4% increase for standard employees (~\$314K)
- **Promotions/Market Adjustments:** 10% of employees (16) will receive adjustments (~\$118K)
- Pay Equity Analysis: Pending results may slightly increase total adjustment
- Wage Breakdown: 61% of standard employees will earn above market rate, 39% at market rate
- FLSA Review: Legal review of FLSA status for mid-pay grade positions to determine overtime eligibility
